GALLIA RURAL WATER PROXY

Commissioners received the notice of annual meeting of membership with the Gallia County Rural Water Association. Being unable to attend, Joe Foster made and Harold Montgomery seconded the motion to sign the membership proxies to validate the meeting and allow the privilege of casting a vote through the designated person on the proxy. OEPA SEWER VIOLATIONS

The County Administrator presented the Commission with the following OEPA sewer violations for May 2011:

- Mercerville WWTP – new inline flow meter has been installed to determine the correct flow through the plant, the flow is very low anywhere from 300 gpd to 600 gpd. There is not enough bacteria for the plant to work correctly. When other residents and the High School tie in, hopefully this will solve our problem. Currently only the Elementary School is connected to the WWTP.
- Meadowlook WWTP – The plant is coming back to normal after the recent rains and infiltration.
- Tara Estates WWTP – The clarifier needs to be pumped and cleaned, because we have no sludge wasting capability, therefore we cannot prevent solids from entering the chlorine contact tank. This will be resolved as soon as the Tara Estates Subdivision can be connected to the new Kanauga/Addison Sewer System.

STATUS REPORT**FY 2009 ARRA CDBG WATER/SEWER GRANT (B-R-09-1AY-1)**

The County Administrator presented the Commission with the Status Report for the period April 1, 2011 thru June 30, 2011 for the County's FY 2009 ARRA CDBG Water/Sewer Grant (B-R-09-1AY-1), which must be submitted to the Ohio Department of Development. Lois Snyder entertained a motion that the Status Report be approved and signed as presented. Harold Montgomery made and Joe Foster seconded that motion. **OPWC GRANT AGREEMENT APPROVAL
2011 COUNTY ENGINEER EMERGENCY SLIP REPAIR PROJECT**

Issue II Coordinator Karen Sprague, presented the Commission with Ohio Public Works Commission grant agreement for the 2011 County Engineer Williams Hollow Slip Repair Project, for approval and signing. This grant provides \$182,506 or 80% of the funding for this project. The other \$45,626 or 20% funding is coming from the County Engineer's M&R fund for a total project of \$228,132. Lois Snyder entertained a motion that the Commission approve and sign the OPWC grant Agreement. Harold Montgomery moved and Joe Foster seconded this motion. Upon roll call votes were as follows: Lois Snyder, yea; Joe Foster, yea; Harold Montgomery, yea.

KA SEWER – RATE RESOLUTION

The County Administrator brought to the Commissions attention that the KA sewer rate resolution was approved before the agreement with the City of Gallipolis for treatment and therefore does not include language to document that the County agreed to utilize the City's outside capacity fee as a tap fee and split the amount 50:50. The current KA sewer rate resolution reflects a tap fee of \$1,500 per EDU (equivalent dwelling unit). The City's current residential capacity fee is \$3,000 and when split 50:50 would give the city and county each \$1,500. Although this amount agrees with the current KA rate resolution, it does not adequately reflect there is an equal portion that will go to the City. The Commission will review this and determine wording to accurately reflect using the City capacity fee being split 50:50. No action taken at this time.

REQUEST FOR PROPOSAL

The Gallia County Department of Job and Family Services (CDJFS) accepted proposals for the provision of transportation services through the agency's Non-Emergency Transportation (NET) program. The provision of the service requires the transporting of Medicaid eligible consumers to scheduled non-emergency medical appointments in

the CDJFS designated "medical community". The following organizations submitted proposals which were opened by the President:

The proposals were turned over to the DJFS Director Glassburn for review and recommendation. The following were in attendance: Judge Dean Evans, Amber Gillenwater and Dana Glassburn

TITLE IV-D – COMMON PLEAS

DJFS Director Dana Glassburn and Common Pleas Judge Dean Evan were present for the signing of the Title IV-D contract. The contract is effective from 7/1/11 through 6/30/12. The unit rate is \$527.28 per Unit of Service as determined by:

- The calculation listed in the JFS 07020 (Governmental Contractor IV-D Contract Budget) for a IV-D Contract with a governmental entity; or
- The procurement process for a IV-D Contract with a private entity.

Total IV-D Contract Cost is \$329,552.36.

RESOLUTION

RENEWAL SUBGRANT AGREEMENT WITH CHILDREN SERVICES

DJFS Director Glassburn submitted the sub grant agreement (G-FY-09-0001) between the Gallia County DJFS and Gallia County Children Services is made pursuant to a grant award to the DJFS by ODJFS and are not for research and development purposes. The grant award is under the authority of Title XX-TANF Transfer, CFDA Number 93.558; Temporary Assistance to Needy Families Block Grant as administered by the US Dept of Health & Human Services.

Harold Montgomery made and Joe Foster seconded the motion to approve the agreement as presented and recommended by Director Glassburn; Roll call: Ms. Snyder, yea; Mr. Foster, yea; Mr. Montgomery, yea.

PURCHASE OF SERVICE CONTRACT RENEWALS

DJFS Director Dana Glassburn presented the following purchase of service contract renewals for approval all with effective dates from 7/1/11 through 6/30/12:

- Woodland Centers – Family Stability activities with TANF; contract cannot exceed \$67,500.
- Winghaven - Effective Family Activities with TANF; contract cannot exceed \$92,500.
- Council on Aging – Adult Protective Services activities; contract cannot exceed \$20,000.
- CAA –Tutoring and Related Education with TANF; contract cannot exceed \$27,500
- CAA - Work participation activities through TANF; contract cannot exceed \$162,500

Joe Foster made and Harold Montgomery seconded the motion to approve contracts as presented and recommended by Director Glassburn. Roll call: Ms. Snyder, yea; Mr. Foster, yea; Mr. Montgomery, yea. Glassburn confirmed there would be enough monies to carry these programs through September 2011.

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING - HOLZER

This memorandum of understanding (MOU), between The Board of County Commissioners, Gallia County, Ohio, on behalf of the Gallia County Department of Job and Family Services (hereinafter *GCDJFS*), and the Holzer Clinic and Holzer Hospital (hereinafter *Holzer*), establishes the cooperative procedures to effectuate the out-stationing of an GCJFS employee at Holzer. The MOU term shall commence on July 1, 2011 and shall expire twelve (12) months from that date unless otherwise terminated or extended by formal agreement.

A GCDJFS employee will be out-stationed at a Holzer facility at 90 Jackson Pike, Gallipolis, Ohio, and will take applications for programs offered through the GCDJFS (such as Workforce Investment Act (WIA) activities, Medicaid, Child Care, Healthy Start, Cash Assistance, Food Stamps, etc.) Applications submitted by Gallia County residents will be processed on site for Healthy Start/Healthy Family programs, Medicaid, Cash Assistance and Food Stamps but may be forwarded to GCDJFS as needed to best serve the applicant (as determined by GCDJFS). Applications submitted by Holzer patients that are from surrounding counties will be sent (by GCDJFS) to the appropriate County for processing (as needed).

Holzer will donate the amount of \$30,000.00 (\$15,000 from Holzer Clinic and \$15,000 from Holzer Hospital) to the Gallia County Commissioners for the purpose of assisting GCDJFS in the outreach project described in this MOU and any other project, etc., deemed necessary by the GCDJFS.

The terms of this MOU does not limit the use of the donation to particular individuals or at a particular facility or institution and precludes reversion to Holzer. As part of signing this MOU, the County Commissioners hereby appropriates the donation to the GCDJFS PA Fund to be used as part of the local portion of the fifty (50%) percent match of the non federal share as allowable for PA activities. The financial contribution of this MOU is based on OAC Section 5101:9-7-50 (G).

PUBLIC HEARING – UNNAMED ALLEY IN VILLAGE OF PORTER

At 11:45 AM, President Lois Snyder opened the road hearing for unnamed alley in the Village of Porter in Springfield Township:

The undersigned petitioners, freeholders of said county residing in the vicinity of the proposed improvement hereinafter described, respectfully represent that the public convenience and welfare require the VACATION of unnamed alley in the Village of Porter - Public Road on the line hereinafter described, and make application to you to institute and order proper proceedings in the premises for vacating such roads, the same not being a road on the State Highway System.

The following is a general route and termini of said roads:

*Being all that part of unnamed alleys in the Village of Porter, Section 24, Township 6, Range 15, Springfield Township, Gallia County, State of Ohio, more particularly described as follows:
Beginning at the northeast corner of Lot 37 in said Village; thence crossing said unnamed alley North 65° East, 25 feet to the northwest corner of Lot 29; thence along the west line of Lots 29, 30, 31 and 32 South 25° East 368.2 feet to the southwest corner of said Lot 32; thence crossing said unnamed alley South 65° West, 25 feet to the southeast corner of Lot 40; thence along the east line of Lots 40, 39 and 37 North 25° West, 368.2 feet, more or less, to the place of beginning.*

Note: All of the vacated above becomes the taxable property of the adjacent property owners at the time of the granted vacation.

The Commissioners advertised the public hearing June 1st and June 8th, 2011 and held a road viewing at 11:45 a.m. on June 9, 2011 and now hold a public hearing on this date at 11:45 a.m. to give testimony upon the necessity of vacating said road (s) and whether the prayer of the petitioners should be granted.

A complete explanation of the petition was given and the following report was read from the County Engineer:

The proposed road vacation consists of vacating an unnamed alley in the Village of Porter from the intersection with State Route 554 to the intersection with Camel Road. Therefore, as Gallia County Engineer, I recommend the vacation of said alley.

Mr. Bill Philips noted that the portion to be vacated runs from State Rte 554 to **Hope Rd** not Camel Rd as stated in the Engineer's report. A call was made to the Engineer's Office requesting a corrected report.

I, Charles Phillips one of said petitioners asking for the vacating of said alley located in the village of Porter. This alley located between said lots has not been maintained by Springfield Township Trustees for at least 40 years that I can recall, but longer than that. My family has taken care of this alley for as long as I can remember. Taking care of this, is keeping the grass mowed. I am fully aware that alley will be divided between owners of adjacent lots, and will be required to pay property taxes on this land.
